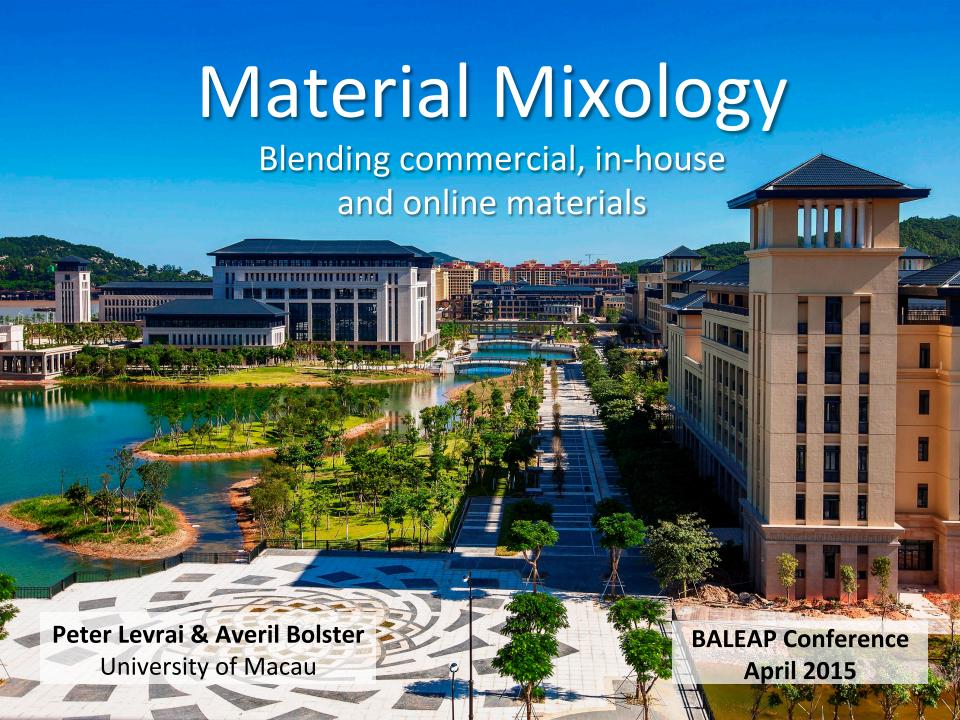
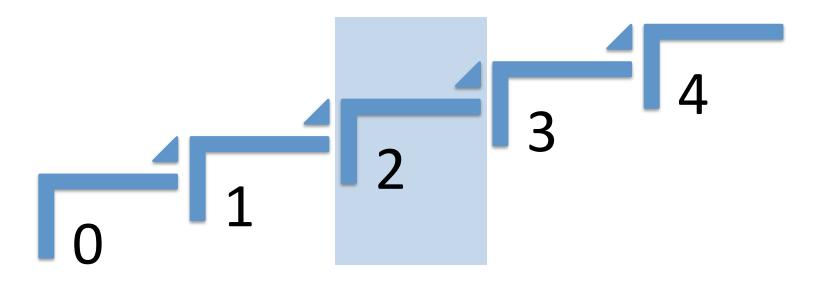

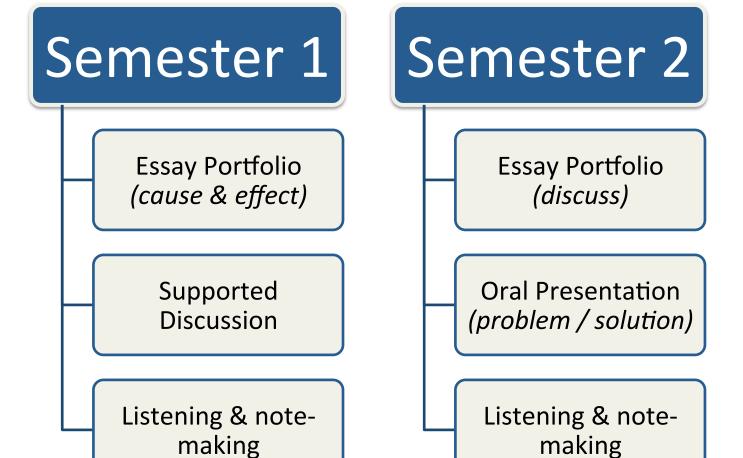

- Not fully criteria-driven evaluation (Tomlinson, 2007) but materials needed to be

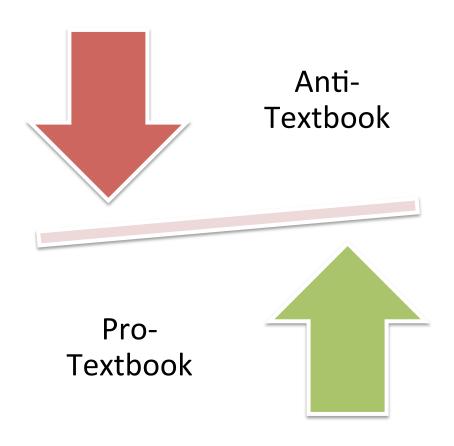

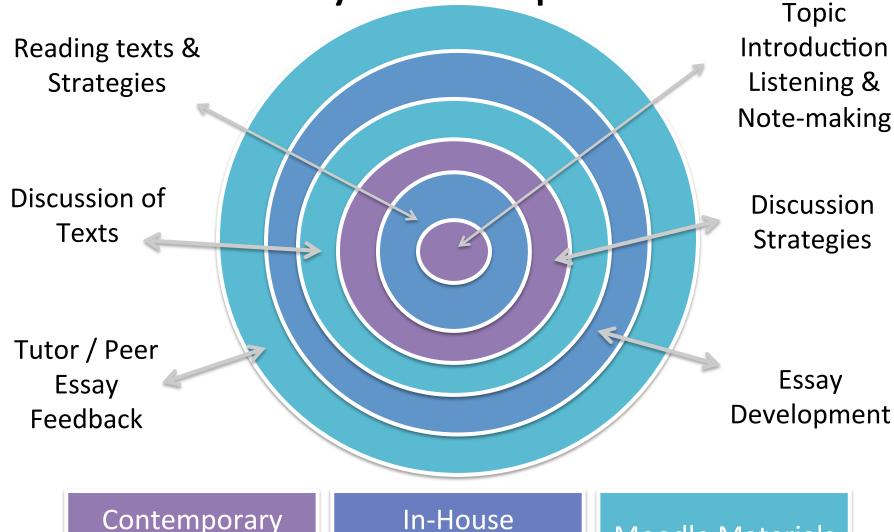

- Ongoing supplementary and revision

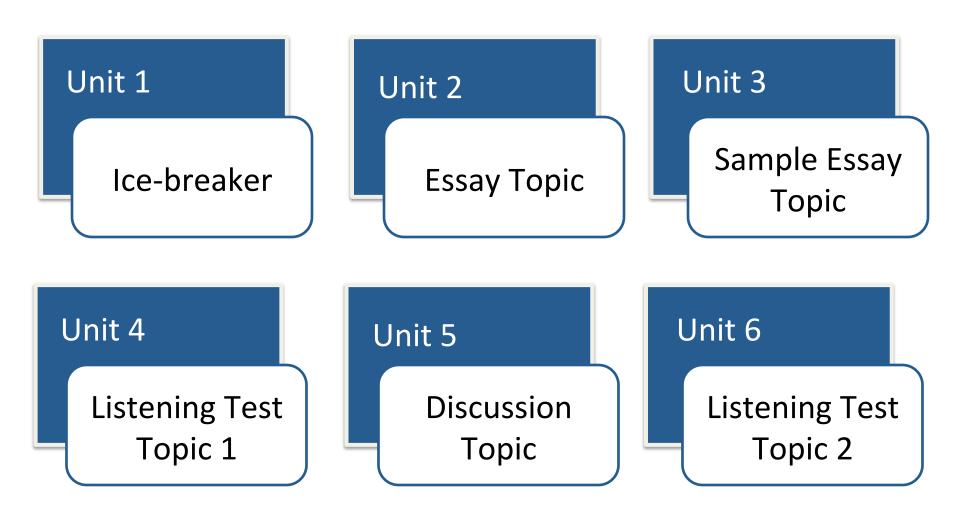
### Time Appropriate

- Moodle extends course time

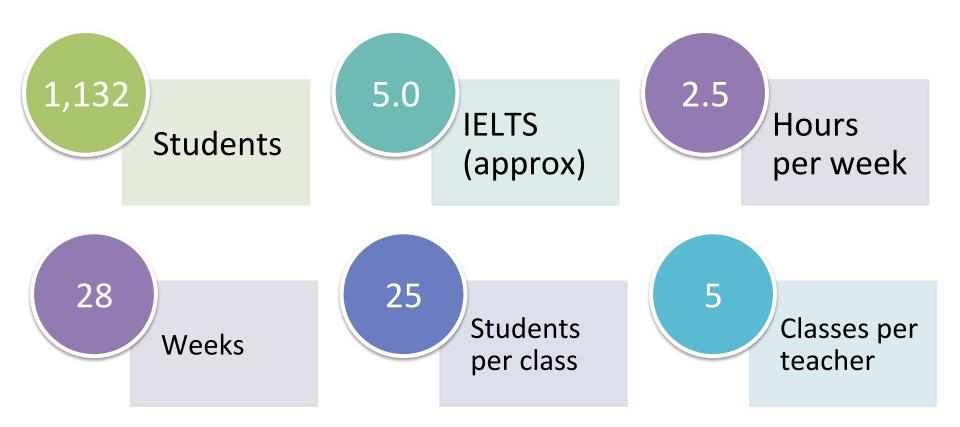
