The challenges of providing an In-sessional EAP module for international students from the Art Design and Media Faculty

Background

- Senior Lecturer Languages (EAP) University of Sunderland –
 2009
- * Responsible for the In-sessional and Pre-sessional support
- * Aim for In-sessional to make it more relevant for students by making the provision more subject specific
- * Including adapting the tasks to the requirement of the students main programmes as much as possible
- * Traditional road blocks were getting the faculties involved in supporting the initiative and resourcing

Background

- * In 2010 Faculty of Art Design and Media directive to improve student experience for international students
- * I was asked to meet with the Associate Dean for Student Experience to discuss the possibility of an English Language support module specifically for the faculty to support international students
- * The plan was to use an existing EAP module code and structure

In the Beginning

- * Granted permission to pilot an EAP module for ADM international students
- * The next issue was which existing EAP module to use as a base students are allocated to modules according to their levels of English
- * A mid level module was chosen for the pilot
- * The next step was how to get students signed up? How to make them aware of the module?

Challenges

- * Teachers?
- * Where to teach it and when? The design centre and the Media centre are on different campuses, timetabling issues
- * Registration in class in the first instance.
- * 2010/11 The first year low student numbers but successful
- * Material development was a challenge a limited amount of communication from main programme tutors

Challenges

- * 2011/12 Large groups initially high drop out rate due to timetable clashes, inappropriate teaching rooms
- * 2012/13 The module was included on to the ADM international students timetables in a bid to attract students. As a result there were too many students for the one module that was running
- * The class did run however with a good number of students and a good completion and pass rate
- * 2013/14 cancelled due to low student numbers

Current Status

- * 2013/14 A separate registration was organised to allow students from ADM who were genuinely interested in the support to sign up. No students attended. Reasons?
- * Eventually the module was cancelled this year due to low student numbers
- * 2014/15 I am planning to run the module again with more co-operation hopefully from the faculty-registration/publication/co-operation (tutors)

Conclusion - Successes

- * A step in the right direction towards ESAP and more relevant In-sessional support for international students
- * Learning about what doesn't work
- * Greater interest in EAP support from other faculties has been generated FAS
- * Cancelling the class has meant that there will have to be more support from ADM for any future provision
